t is my pleasure to write to you as we reflect on what has been another busy and successful

term here at Parkhall Integrated College.

As always, it is exciting to welcome a new batch of year 8 pupils, and we are delighted at how quickly they have settled into school life. This year, we were heavily over-subscribed with 201 applications in total. We currently have 177 year 8 pupils spread across seven form classes, coming to us from 24 different primary schools. Already, these pupils have been involved in Take 5, tracking assessments, study skills workshops, cyberbullying talks and other activities.

Unfortunately, Covid restrictions continue to impact on some of our normal activities, but we have been fortunate enough to see the return of many of our after-school clubs, breakfast club for years 8 and 9, Young Enterprise activities and our year 8 house competitions.

In terms of academic achievement, it is always a pleasure to see so many of our year 12 pupils from last year being recognised at a socially distanced Prize Day in October, and it was very satisfying to see that many have returned to our post-16 courses. We continue to be delighted to hear of the progress of last year's year 14 group as they make their way into employment, university or further education. It was also a great pleasure to see so many of our pupils rewarded during Prize Day, attendance assemblies or class prize assemblies. The internal school exams were completed in November/December. The parent consultation meetings will take place throughout this term, and we will forward details of how we will be able to manage these in these difficult circumstances in due course.


Anti-Bullying Week, 15th-19th Dec
